CHECK UP:

Memory work: We will not hide them from their descendants; we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the LORD, his power, and the wonders he has done. - Psalm 78:4

Did you have an opportunity to share your testimony this past week? If not, do you have someone in mind to share it with?

OPEN:

- Who did you B.L.E.S.S. this past week? What action steps did you take?

READ and ASK: Psalm 99

- What does this Psalm say about God?
- What does it mean for God to be holy?

READ Psalm 99 again as well as John 1:29, Colossians 2:13-14, Hebrews 9:26b-28, Revelation 15:2-4

- What does this Psalm say about ourselves/people?
- What stands out most from these passages?
- How does reading of the holiness of God in Psalm 99 and then reading these New Testament passages impact you today?

APPLY:

- In what ways do these texts most challenge you?
- How do we hold God's mercy and grace in tension with God's holiness? Do you tend to think of God only as loving or holy?
- What are some valuable truths that this text contains that you can share with others?
- NEXT STEP: How does your position before God need to impact the way you live this week?
