This week's reading: Psalm 133
Discussion Guide: February 11, 2024

CHECK UP:

Memory work: If you, LORD, kept a record of sins, Lord, who could stand? But with you there is forgiveness, so that we can, with reverence, serve you. – Psalm 130:3-4

- Did you linger on God's forgiveness in any particular way this past week?

OPEN:

- Who did you B.L.E.S.S. this past week? What action steps did you take?

READ and ASK: Psalm 133

- What stands out from the text?
- What does this Psalm say about God?

READ Psalm 133 again with John 17:20-23; Proverbs 6:16-19; Ephesians 4:1-6

- What does this Psalm say about ourselves/people?
 - o How does "live together" (in verse 1) give extra insight into real unity?
- What do the other texts teach us about unity?
- How do these texts contradict the idea of being a "solo Christian"?

APPLY:

- How do we foster unity in our church?
 - o What are some dangerous behaviors that threaten unity?
- In what way has Christian unity been of great value to you?
- In what way does this text most speak to you?
- What are some valuable truths that this text contains that you can share with others?
- NEXT STEP: What attitudes or behaviors need to change in you in order to live in pursuit of Christian unity? What steps can you begin this week?
