Stand to the End: Genuine Care

Scripture reading: 1 Peter 2:4-5; Acts 6:1-7; Mattew 22:35-40; 1 Corinthians 12:25-27; Ephesians 4:11-13

CHECK UP:

*Memory Work: Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to your neighbor, for we are all members of one body. - Ephesians 4:25

*Did you take any step in faithful accountability this week (either in being held accountable or holding someone else accountable)?

OPEN:

- What was a highlight in your week this past week? What was a particular challenge you had?
- Did you B.L.E.S.S. someone this past week? (Begin in prayer, Listen, Eat, Serve, Share)

Go through each passage below and ask: What do these passages say about genuinely caring for one another? Try and share some practical ways in which each passage can teach us to genuinely care for one another.

READ and ASK: 1 Peter 2:4-5; Acts 6:1-7; Matthew 22:35-40; 1 Corinthians 12:25-27; Ephesians 4:11-13; Galatians 6:1-5, 10; Romans 12:5

- Which one of these passages challenges you the most? Why?
- How would you define "genuine care" in a biblically sound way?
- How does the great commission (Matthew 28:18-20) fit into or coincide with offering genuine care to one another? (also see John 13:34-35, Acts 2:42-47)
- Why is the individualistic idea of "just me and Jesus" not supported by the Bible?
- Why is Christianity not a "spectator sport"?
 - o In what ways can we easily fall into the trap of making Christianity a "spectator sport"?
 - o What are some practical ways we can combat this?

APPLY:

- **Read Romans 12:9-12:** What practical applications does this passage give us for genuinely caring for one another?
 - o Which proactive action do you need to most work on?
- Tell about a time when you have seen the church genuinely care for one another?
- NEXT STEP: At the conclusion of this series, which of the three values needs the most immediate attention from you? (Biblical encouragement, faithful accountability, genuine care)
 - o Which one does this group need to give most attention to?
 - o What actions can be taken?
