- Which of these do you think you do well with?
- Which do you struggle with?
- What are you most challenged by with these passages?
- Which passage do you need to commit to memory?

APPLY:

- What opportunities do you have to be salt and light during this election season?
 - o How can you use political tensions for the purpose of disciple making?
- Turbulent elections often reveal the fruit of our discipleship. What fruit do you see in your life? Is it healthy or unhealthy fruit?
- NEXT STEP: What is one thing you need to repent of and one thing you can proactively do to be salt and light in this election season?

How do we follow Jesus during a turbulent election?

- 1) Remember who you are (2 Corinthians 5:16-20; Philippians 3:20; 1 Peter 2:11-12)
 - 2) Make mission the top priority (Matthew 28:18-20)
 - 3) Character is of upmost importance (Matthew 5:3-16, 5:43-48; John 13:34-35)
 - 4) Remember morality matters (Isaiah 5:20; Romans 1:32)
 - 5) Don't fall victim to the culprit of slander (Matthew 15:19; Ephesians 4:31)
 - 6) Use the weapon of prayer (1 Timothy 2:1-6)
- 7) We are instructed to be good citizens in this world (Romans 13:1-7; Titus 3:1-2)
 - 8) Keep an eternal perspective (Hebrews 11:1-12:2)
