Jesus Stories This week's reading: Luke 13:1-9 Discussion Guide: March 23, 2025

CHECK UP:

*Memory Work: Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is-his good, pleasing and perfect will. - Romans 12:2

*In what ways did you strive to live in God's will this past week?

OPEN:

- What was a highlight in your week this past week? What was a particular challenge you had?
- Did you B.L.E.S.S. someone this past week? (Begin in prayer, Listen, Eat, Serve, Share)

READ and ASK: Luke 13:1-9; 2 Peter 3:8-14

- Why do you think people often assume that people suffer because they are uniquely bad?
 - What is the danger of associating someone's misfortune with sin?
- What did Jesus mean by his warning, "unless you repent, you too will all perish?"
- Why did Jesus tell the fig tree parable after discussing the two tragic events?
- What does it mean to bear fruit?
- How does 2 Peter 3:8-14 challenge you?

APPLY:

- What "second chances" has God given you?
- Is there anything you have been spiritually "putting off"? (*Repentance is for today*.)
- If you literally had one more year to produce fruit like the fig tree, what would you do? (John 15:1-8)
 - NEXT STEP: How does that place priority in your life for this week?
 - What fruit do you think God wants you to be producing by this time next year?

Memory Work:

The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance. - 2 Peter 3:9
