# **Bold and Powerful**

Week's reading: Acts 14:1-15:41 Discussion Guide: Nov 5, 2023

#### **CHECK UP:**

Memory work: So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off. - Acts 13:3

In what ways did you strive to live according to the Holy Spirit's prompting this past week?

### **OPEN:**

- Who did you B.L.E.S.S. this past week? What action steps did you take?
  - o How did you live bold and powerful this past week?
- What stood out to you from this past week's reading?
  - o What questions do you have?

#### READ and ASK: Acts 15:1-21

- What was the question that was being asked in the minds of the Jewish leaders? (vs 1-5) (What were the trouble makers teaching?)
  - Why was this issue so important? How was this issue bigger than just the subject of circumcision?
  - What might be some comparable issues in the church today? What beliefs or practices do Christians add to the gospel?
- What did Peter emphasize when he spoke to the counsel?
  - o What did Paul and Barnabas emphasize?
  - o What did James emphasize?
    - What was James's verdict?
- Carefully describe the process of resolving this conflict (vs 6-21).
  - What do you think we can learn about resolution of a disagreement from the way the Jewish leaders worked toward resolution?

#### **APPLY:**

- When dealing with difficult issues, what do we need to include in the decision-making process?

- What areas of your faith create conflict within you?
  - o Where can you get help resolving an issue you are unsure about?
- The Church leaders seem very concerned about the integrity of the gospel and the unity of the church.
  - o What should that look like for us?
    - How do we protect the key truths of the gospel?
    - What does it look like to work for unity? (it won't happen by accident).
- A key moto of the Restoration Movement is "in essentials, unity, in nonessentials (or opinions), liberty, and in all things love." A great debate/discussion can arise around the question of essentials.
  - Devin is growing to believe that essentials are two things: 1) The baptism confession (Jesus as savior and Lord), and 2) the fruit confirming the truth of that confession (the evidence that Jesus is Lord in someone's life).
  - o How would that definition of essentials keep us unified, but also give us the opportunity for correction? How would it also leave room for opinions/non-essentials?
- NEXT STEP: In what way do you need to strive for unity while standing firm on the core truths of the gospel?
